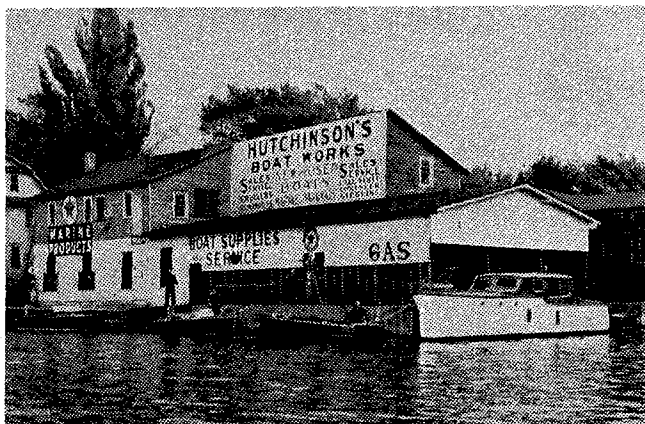

## HUTCHINSON BOAT WORKS OF ALEXANDRIA BAY, NEW YORK

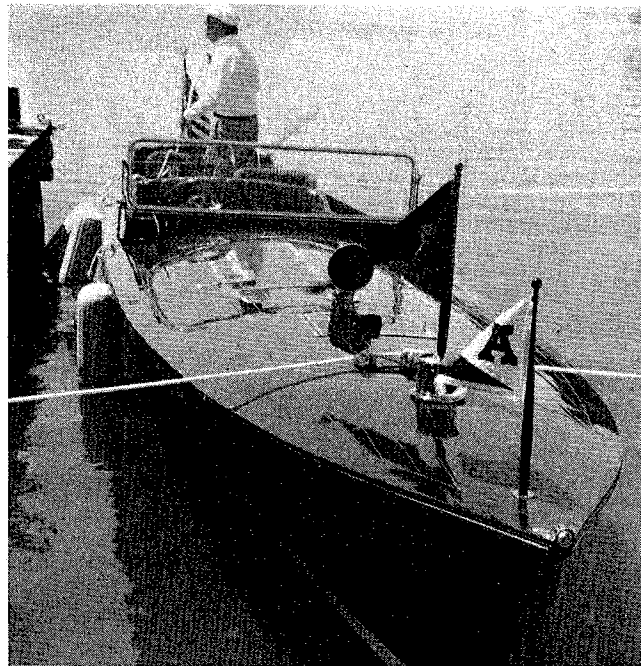
I put out a plea for material on Hutchinson launches, particularly the sedan variety, and did get some help in that vein from two good friends, Riggs Smith and Ray Rogers of Rogers Marina of Alexandria Bay, New York. Both of these fellows dug into their files to share excellent material with us here. I will try to lay the photos out in the order of their age, starting with the oldest first.

Hutchinson runabouts closely resembled Hacker Crafts. At one time I guess there was some talk concerning possible litigation pending between both firms, but nothing ever happened as far as I could find out. The very first photo is a 1940-41 view of the Hutchinson Boat Works from the water. A lot has changed around there since then. One of the hits at the 8th Annual Lake Minnetonka Antique & Classic Boat Rendezvous was the 1915 30-foot launch, *Frolic*. This very beautiful boat swept several awards and actually was the first Hutchinson ever seen out here in our part of the world. Quite a few people mentioned they would never have known what a Hutchinson launch was except for having seen it in one of my books. While running at full speed, this launch sliced through the water at a very nice pace, throwing much less wake than most launches do. Doctor

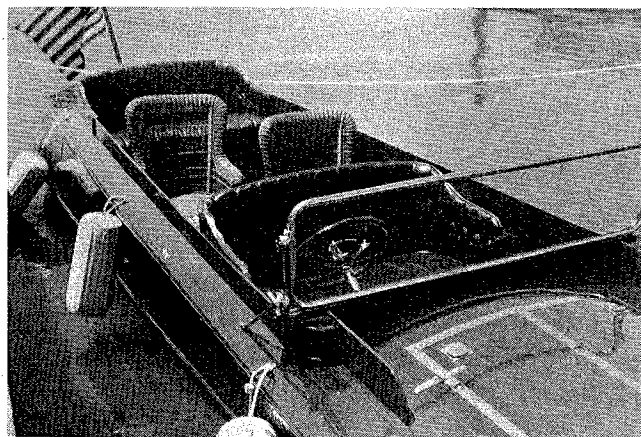


1941 view of Hutchinson's Boat Works in Alexandria Bay, N.Y.
